

# **Ligonier Valley Writers presents the 36th annual Student Poetry Contest**

## **CONTEST RULES**

**Deadline: March 11, 2026**

**LVW is only accepting submissions through the provided contest form.**

**Please do not snail mail copies of poems.**

**1. Eligibility.** Open to all students in grades 4-12 in southwestern PA.

**2. Limit.** One entry per student in each category. A maximum of 20 lines per poem.

Exception: In the haiku category (three lines long), you may submit up to three poems. Please submit each haiku separately.

**3. Qualifications.** Entries must be the contestant's original work and must not have won a prize in any other contest or been published before. No AI, please.

**4. Winning Poets.** Winners will be notified in April. Prizes will be presented at an awards ceremony at the Greensburg Barnes & Noble at 4:00 p.m. on a Saturday in late April. Winning poets will have a chance to read their poems to the audience. The list of winners will be sent to local media and posted on [www.LVWonline.org](http://www.LVWonline.org) afterward.

**5. Publication rights.** Ligonier Valley Writers retains the right to *first* publication of prize-winning poets. Authors retain all other copyrights.

**6. NOTE TO TEACHERS:** Please communicate all rules to your students. Students must choose their own topics, and all poems must be in good final form. Large batches of unedited poems will not be read. You may want to conduct your own class poetry contest and have your students select the top entries to submit to this contest.

**Parents and guardians: You may sponsor your child's entry by providing your contact information on the Contest Form (link below).**

### **7. Poetry Judging Criteria**

- a. Aptness of title.
- b. Impact (powerful effect).
- c. Effectiveness and meaning.
- d. Universality.
- e. Imagery.
- f. Suitability (appropriateness to contest category and age level).
- g. Continuity of theme.
- h. Craftsmanship (aptness of phrase, freshness of rhyme, economy of words, rhythmic quality, appropriate mechanics, grammar).

**8. Format.** Go to <https://www.lvwonline.org/spcform2026> to fill out the entry form and paste or type in your poem.

The form will ask you to specify the poet's grade and the poem category. See the next page for a list of the nine submission categories.
